I look forward to continuing and working as a team with you all again.

To think we are beginning a brand new academic school year again and pupils have moved up a class!! The year whizzed by and I am sure the same will happen this year! Everyone has returned refreshed and ready to face another busy half term settling into school routines and setting expectations.

This year, we welcome 5 new Nursery pupils joining our school.

We also welcome Edward and Joseph Ashworth from UK, pupils in Yr 1 and 2, and Riyaaz Peters who joined us in the latter part of last half term from Ascension. We seem to have fallen in number at the moment beginning this year as some pupils have left to go overseas or are on overseas holiday. Currently we have 106 on roll, the lowest in any years!

For all new parents, a newsletter will be sent to you to keep you informed of school events that will occur over the course of each half term. In addition, you will also receive a Curriculum Letter from your child's class teacher to keep you updated with curriculum coverage, school visits and any other general expectations.

Staffing:

Our staffing structure beginning this academic year is attached with this newsletter. Due to staffing shortages and falling numbers, Yr 1 and Yr 2 have combined as a class taught by Mrs Sally Young, but they will be taught horizontally

for the core subjects supported by Miss Sheena Henry (Classroom Instructor). Thanks to Miss Henry for stepping up to this challenge at this time. This has

been done in all three schools. We will continue to see if we can recruit to fill vacant gaps.

We would appreciate any voluntary support (for reading, extra-curricular lunch time activities, after school clubs, library support, our enrichment programmes etc) and would ask that you contact the school should you wish to support in any way. We are looking for new initiatives. You will be required to obtain a vetting certificate first.

We also have two ASDAN students coming into school from PAS this half term. They are Adrianna Osborne and Madison Yon.

Curriculum.



May I also remind you as parents, the importance of your children achieving their full potential within their year. Please encourage and work with your child as much as you can at home to enable them to aspire. Your support

and commitment will be a real boost to their learning. Remember, we work as a partnership in your child's education, teachers cannot do it all on their own. Do take the time to work with your child's class teacher and ask how your child is doing in respect of their expectations. Teachers have now seen the information received from their previous teacher along with their teacher Assessments and PIE/PIM results and will aim to get most pupils to Age Related expectations. We have analysed our PIE/PIM results and have seen some progress made, subsequently we have also seen the areas that need to be worked on by each individual as well.

Choir/Ukulele tuition

At the moment as Miss Lucy is overseas on medical, we are not able to offer this during the lunchtime but if there is anyone who might like to support us in the interim period we would like to hear from you.

Yr 4 and 6 CATs (Cognitive Ability tests) online tests

CATs help us to understand how individual children learn and what their potential might be. Teachers can use CAT information to help plan their lessons to meet the needs of the child.

In Yr 4 they are used to identify potential under performance and to set targets for Yr 6.

This year Yr 5 will also do this as it was not done last year.

In Yr 6 to provide information to PAS for KS3 targets. These will hopefully take place this term once we get dates sorted by the Primary Sector. This will give us an indication as to what we can do throughout the year to address any areas of weaknesses and the styles of learning that your child is suited to.



As you know, we have lost our Chair and Vice Chair to overseas employment. We

will be having our PTA AGM alongside our Back to school curriculum evening, including an Early Years Phonics workshop, where we will need to elect a new Committee. Do think about nominating a Chair, Vice, Secretary and Treasurer plus year group rep. We take this opportunity to thank our outgoing Committee for their contributions to the year and look forward to working with new/or some of the same people. Remember this is for your children and school.

The Solihull Approach is a not-for-profit, NHS organisation for parents and professionals to support emotional health and well-being in children, families, and adults. The sound and well-researched ideas developed by a team of clinical psychologists and a range of other professionals that underpin the approach are embedded in every aspect of training. Designed to support parents at every stage of their journey, from pregnancy to adolescence, these courses empower parents and professionals to better understand a child's brain development, decode their behaviours, and develop nurturing relationships, all aimed at fostering kindness, confidence, and emotional awareness in children who thrive throughout their lives.

The Health and Social Care Directorate's 0-19 Health Service Team recognises the importance of nurturing emotionally resilient and socially aware children within its community, building on the current work of our multiagency teams around the education and safeguarding of our children, as well as supporting parents, carers and professionals on St Helena. Key highlights of the Inourplace online courses include:

 Understanding your child's emotional health and brain development: Parents will gain insights into the science behind their child's brain development, helping them make informed decisions that support healthy cognitive growth.

- Reading your child's behaviours: These
 courses will provide parents with tools to
 interpret and respond effectively to their
 child's behaviours, fostering positive
 interactions and reducing stress for both
 parents and children.
- Developing communication: Parents will learn strategies for open and effective communication that will strengthen the parent-child bond and promote emotional well-being.
